# **Our Shelter**

Casa Q's Youth Shelter is a safe haven for unhoused LGBTQ+ youth ages 14-17, offering more than just shelter—it's a place of healing, growth, and belonging. In 2024, five youth found safety and support through our trauma-informed care model, which prioritizes stability, empowerment, and individualized pathways toward the future. Our dedicated staff work alongside each young person, providing life skills workshops, personalized planning, and encouragement to embrace their full selves. Every interaction reflects Casa Q's commitment to creating vibrant opportunities and fostering a strong sense of community for the most vulnerable among us.

# TLP

Now in its third year, Casa Q's Transitional Living
Program (TLP) has become a vital source of stability and
opportunity for LGBTQ+ young adults ages 18-22. This
program offers housing, where four young adults live
independently in safe, fully equipped studio apartments,
and Case Management, which provides wraparound
services and intensive case management. Through TLP,
participants build essential life skills—budgeting, selfcare, communication, job readiness, and more—while
also receiving mentorship in navigating critical legal
processes such as name and gender marker changes. In
2024, our clients made incredible strides toward
independence, building futures rooted in resilience, selfdetermination, and hope.

Through our compassionate and dedicated Transitional Living Program, we've been able to provide not only housing but also personalized case management and essential life skills to five incredibly resilient young individuals. In late 2023, we faced an unexpected challenge and temporarily paused our beloved 24/7 multiservice shelter due to staffing issues. However, during this period of reflection, our dedicated team and board of directors worked tirelessly to redevelop our innovative programming and train new, passionate team members. With renewed vigor, we proudly reopened our doors in July 2024, providing a safe haven and housing for five remarkable young people aged 14-17.

At Casa Q, we remain unwaveringly hopeful for the future and are deeply committed to continuing our mission with the invaluable support of our extraordinary donors. Together, we show up every day for the young people in our community, ensuring they have the support, love, and opportunities they need to thrive. "Casa Q is more than a shelter—it's a lifeline for LGBTQ+ youth experiencing homelessness or instability. Every day, I have the privilege of working alongside these young people, witnessing their growth, resilience, and self-discovery. There is something incredibly powerful about making a difference in a community that I, too, belong to.

One of the most striking aspects of Casa Q is the unwavering support from the broader community. I'm especially moved by the way churches have stepped up—historically, faith communities and LGBTQ+ spaces have often been at odds, but here, I see churches showing up without judgment or hesitation. TLP is another game-changer, bridging a critical gap in services for young adults aging out of systems that often fail them. 


